



The Saskatchewan Eco-Network (SEN) is a non-profit, non-governmental organization whose members are Saskatchewan environmental groups. The SEN connects environmentalists with each other, both within the province and across Canada by promoting active networking among its members.

SEN staff help members, media, government personnel and the general public connect with others who have skills and information they need.

There is a great deal of diversity within the SEN membership and the Canadian Environmental Network (RCEN), so the networks have a policy of not taking positions on specific issues. This allows for valuable discussion and dialogue, but does not demand member groups conform to any particular position on an issue. This also means that the network is not an advocacy coalition or lobbying organization, but rather, is a communications structure to allow members to do their own activities more effectively.

Benefits of Membership

Through the Saskatchewan Eco-Network, members can:

- Share information, skills, publicity vehicles and other resources, collaborate on strategies, and even organize joint projects with fellow member groups and individuals with common interests and issues.
- Attend general membership meetings and working group meetings where people meet face-to-face.
- Receive the SEN Info Bulletin, our biweekly email newsletter that includes news items about prominent Saskatchewan environmental issues, updates from member organizations and working groups, announcements of events, meetings, public hearings and new programs, websites of interest, and reports on the activities of member groups.
- Connect with the Canadian Environmental Network (RCEN), and affiliates in other provinces and territories.
- Connect across provincial boundaries, collect and share information and examine the cumulative impacts of provincial and federal policies, and promote a broader perspective on the issues by participating in RCEN national caucuses on forests, mining, toxics, health and sustainability, biotechnology, atmosphere and energy, water, environmental assessment, harmonization, ecological economics, and youth.
